

The Asian Studies minor is an **interdisciplinary program** that combines courses in **languages**, **arts**, **humanities**, **and social sciences** to give students a full understanding of East Asian culture. Course options include **China Through Literature**, **Political Economy of East Asia**, **Asian Heritage**, and numerous history courses.

Minor Requirements

The minor requires five courses, including:

 - HIS 270: Religion, Identity, and Politics in Asian History
 - HIS 370: Empire and Asian Connections
 - POL 231: Politics of China
 - · POL 233: Politics of East Asia
 - POL 250: US-China Relations
- One additional course in Mandarin Chinese or an additional non-language course on Asia
